Sermon Notes for Churched: We Partner Together (Ephesians 2:19-22; 3:6 and other Scriptures)

- Partnership in a local church is often misunderstood or neglected.
- **Common reasons why** people resist joyfully partnering with a local church are:
- 1. "I've had bad experiences with churches"
- 2. "I don't trust the leadership"
- 3. "I don't believe in church membership, it's not in the Bible"
- 4. "I don't agree with everything this church believes"
- 5. "I'm a member of another church"
- The church is not a club (based upon a common interest) or service provider (based upon a common need or desire), but an embassy of "the kingdom of His beloved Son" as one nation (heavenly) representing the Lord's authority, name, reputation and glory inside another nation (earthly).
- **Ephesians 2:19-22; 36** reveal our unique connection to the church as fellow citizens, God's household, a whole building being fitted together, a holy temple, a dwelling of God in the Spirit, fellow heirs, fellow members of the body, fellow partakers.
  - There is no such thing as a commitment to the head of the body (Christ) without a commitment to His body.
  - You cannot fulfill your Scriptural obligations to God, church leaders and other believers without the local church and neither can other believers fulfill theirs.
  - Partnership or membership in a local church is a special, official and beneficial partnership to faithfully know, love and serve Christ and fellow believers.
- There are four **biblical reasons** why every follower of Jesus Christ should formally, willingly and submissively be a functioning partner in a local church:
- 1. Your local church partnership honors your Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
- It's the Lord's church ("My church" Matt. 16:18) and He's the "head" of the church (Eph. 1:22; 4:15; 5:23; Col. 1:18)
- The Lord is the "foundation" (1 Cor 3:11), goal (Col. 1:28), groom (Eph. 5:25-27), message (1 Cor. 1:23) or the past (crucified), present (risen and High Priest) and future (coming again) of the church to name a few.
- Matthew 16:18-19 (18:18) gives the church authority ("the keys" and "binding and loosing")
- Revelation 2-3 shows how the Lord walks among the seven churches of Asia Minor and assesses, warns, appeals and rewards them
- 2. Your local church partnership honors your spiritual leaders.

- **Shepherding:** God uses leaders (pastors, elders, overseers) to "shepherd the flock of God" (1 Pet. 5:2) by which the church is cared for (Acts 20:28; Heb. 13:17; 1 Thess. 5:12-13)
- **Submission:** God uses believers to submit to the shepherding and guidance of its spiritual leaders (Heb. 13:7, 17)
- 3. Your local church partnership honors your fellow believers.
- You can't flourish in your faith without a strong, active commitment to a local body of believers.
  - An inactive, disconnected believer is a contradiction, living in deception and needs to repent.
  - How can disconnected or loosely connected believers fulfill commands to "love one another" (Jn 13:34) or "bear one another's burdens" (Gal. 6:2) or "employ your gift in serving one another" (1 Pt 4:10)?
- Every church metaphor assumes and expects a united, intentional and active partnership
  - "branches" depict our collective dependence on Jesus the Vine and His life that flows through us (John 15:1-5)
  - A "holy temple" depicts God's dwelling with us as we worship together (Eph. 2:20-22)
  - "living stones" depict our "being built up as a spiritual house" anchored by the orienting "Cornerstone" (1 Pet. 2:4-6)
  - The "body" depicts our mutual dependence and different roles played for the good health of the church (1 Cor 12:12-27)
  - The "bride" depicts our faithfulness to our groom Jesus Christ to be without "spot or wrinkle...holy and blameless" (Eph. 5:26-27)
- Notice some of our **F.A.M.I.L.Y**. ("God's household" Eph. 2:19) obligation
  - **Fellowship**: We share a fellowship obligation (one another's; Heb. 3:12-13)
  - Advertisement: We share an advertising obligation to proclaim the gospel (John 13:35; Matt. 28:19-20)
  - Ministry: We share a ministry obligation as gifted believers who serve one another (1 Pet. 4:10-11)
  - o **Investment**: We share an investment obligation to financially support the ministry of the church (2 Cor. 9:6-8)
  - Liability: We share a liability obligation to God and fellow believers as we hold each other accountable (1 Cor. 5:7; Matt. 18:15-18)
  - Yoking: We share a yokefellow obligation as we are "diligent to preserve the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (Eph. 4:2-3; Phil. 4:3)

- 4. Your local church partnership honors your personal faith.
- **Clubs or service providers** are all about your preferences, benefits and choices, but the church is all about the Lord's preference, benefit and choice.
- **Ephesians 4:11-16** leads to "the proper working of <u>each individual part</u> which causes the growth of the body for the building up of itself in love" (v. 16)
- If you wander as a lamb (Matt. 12-14), it's your local church that Jesus will send after you (Matt. 18:15-20)
