What are the Disagreements about the Holy Spirit?

Week 4 | Jan 30 & Feb 1, 2024

Session Purpose: The aim of this session is to use God's Word to analyze and understand some of the disagreements regarding the ministry of the Holy Spirit.

Introduction:

- There are two main distinctive groups in Christianity:
 - 1) Charismatic/Pentecostals (656M worldwide & 68M in North America spread out in 2,321 denomination World Christian Encyclopedia)
 - Non-Charismatic/Pentecostals (387M worldwide & 71M in North America spread out over 1,249 denominations and movements - World Christian Encyclopedia)
- There are basically four disagreements about the ministry of the Holy Spirit:

• Can a believer commit the unforgiveable sin of blaspheming the Holy Spirit?

- _____ (Matt. 12:24-32, Mark 3:22-30; Luke 11:17-23)
- After healing a demonized man who was blind and mute, the crowds were amazed and the religious leaders were appalled and concluded that Jesus was "possessed by Beelzebul" (Jn 7:20; 8:48, 52; 10:20) & casting "out the demons" by "the ruler of the demons" (Mk 3:22).
- Jesus refutes their blasphemous charges by saying their accusation was irrational (Mk. 3:23-24), inconsistent (Mt 12:27), and indefensible (Mt. 12:28-30).
- There is ____ sin that cannot be forgiven by God for those who truly repent, including the sin of blasphemy (God forgave Peter in Mr. 14:71; Paul's blasphemies & persecution 1 Tim. 1:12–17)

•	But not those who conclude that the ministry of Jesus is enabled by Satan. That is an eternal sin that is a defiant, deliberate and determined rejection refusal of God's salvation in Christ. This is hardened		
2	Is being slain in the Spirit a biblical practice?		
•	because it is not taught in Scripture.		
•	All the prooftexts fall short and do not meet the prescription of being slain in the Spirit (1 Kings 8:10-11; Ex. 40:34-38; John 18:5-6; Acts 26:13-14; Rev. 1:7)		
6	Can a believer expect the Holy Spirit to speak to them today?		
•	It upon what you mean by the word "speak".		
•	Romans 8:14: ""For all who are being led by the Spirit of God, these are sons and daughters of God."		
•	Having the Spirit speak has been described as being led by your thoughts, feelings, impressions, convictions, teachings, direct words or teaching on how to hear the voice of God, but is this true?		
•	Some have taught various methods to hear the voice of the Spirit:		
	1) Ask for specific method:		
	2) for the "still small voice" method (1 Kings 19:11-15)		
	3) "Read the" method: It is looking for little events as a sign from God		
	4) Open, point and method.
